2023 at White Bluff: Break Up Your Fallow Ground

Hosea 10:12,

"and Jacob must break up the ground.

12 Sow righteousness for yourselves,
reap the fruit of unfailing love,
and break up your unplowed (fallow) ground;
for it is time to seek the LORD,
until he comes
and showers his righteousness on you."

My personal devotion time recently has been incredible! I started a chapter-by-chapter reading beginning in Jeremiah with the Babylonian captivity. As of writing this newsletter article in mid-December, I am finishing Joel and headed into Amos next. Pray for me! Pray that I will have the fire and tenacity to press on and that God will continually reveal Himself to me as I read (I am praying the same for you, friends!). I am amazed by a common thread throughout the books of the Bible I am reading. God is with us all the time, God offers Himself to us all the time, and God gives us a choice of whether or not to listen and follow Him. Those who listen and follow are blessed beyond belief. Those who choose their own way do so at their own peril.

The other key theme throughout the entirety of Scripture is a recognition that life is hard. Take Daniel as an example. He made it through King Nebuchadnezzar's throwing him into the fiery furnace with Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. Not long after, King Darius threw Daniel into the lion's den. Daniel suffered unjust punishment. Daniel went through continual trials and difficulties. Even so, Daniel was faithful.

Exodus 34:14 discusses that God's name is "jealous." Feelings of jealousy come when a person suspects that someone else has been unfaithful. God is a jealous God in the sense that He wants us to be completely faithful to Him, first and foremost. Hosea 10:12 will serve as our theme verse at White Bluff in 2023 because it shows us the formula to remain faithful to the great I AM. It begins by telling the people to break up the unplowed (or fallow) ground. It is the process by which we take the tough areas of our lives and seek to make them soft yet again so that God can speak to us afresh and anew. My Granddaddy Giddens used to own a tiller that my dad inherited. It was a beastly machine that had big teeth on the end of it. When we were ready to plant a garden or flowers, we would break up the fallow ground.

If you remember The Parable of the Sower in Matthew 13, the seed that fell on the unplowed, fallow, hardest ground (the path) didn't have a chance to sprout or grow because it became bird food. The birds scooped it up before it could take root. When we break up the ground of our hearts by listening to God, we become more capable of allowing God's love and wisdom to take root in our loves. We allow God to sow His right-eousness into us and through us into others. Our prayers go from wish lists to listening to the awesome voice of God. Our daily Bible study goes from a chore to a necessity because we are dependent upon our great big God for strength and guidance just to make it through the next day. Notice that when we break up the ground, God plants His unfailing love in us... the key word there being "unfailing." It is a love that is without error or fault, always constant and reliable.

My prayer for White Bluff in 2023 is that we would seek the Lord even more until He comes! Notice that we seek the Lord UNTIL HE COMES... we don't give up. We remain faithful to Him. Seek the Lord and His righteousness, and all these other things shall be added to you as well! (Matthew 6:33). I pray for God to shower His righteousness on us so that we may in turn shower His righteousness into the surrounding neighborhoods, Savannah, Chatham County, and on into the world!




Childrens Church

CHURCH CAMP




